AP Students: (through 5/18 then only on Mondays for rest of SY)

Please review the following information about your AP exams:

- Details about e-tickets for the exams:
 - Students can't take this year's AP exam without their e-ticket
 - College Board will send the e-tickets by email 2 days before the exam (they can also be found in your My AP account)
 - Students need it to check in to their exams on exam day (you should check in 30 minutes before the start of your exam)
 - Each test will have a unique e-ticket
 - Each e-ticket is personalized to each student and contains your AP ID so DO NOT share it.
- If students experience a problem during the test, you need to fill out this form ASAP:
https://education.co1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_1B9R7XJa9dXaQBv
 - Only fill this out if you attempted the test and were not able to complete your exam.
 - If you received your e-ticket for the test in May, but did not use the e-ticket, you DO NOT need to submit this form. You will automatically receive another e-ticket for the June test.
 - It CANNOT be used for the portfolio courses (at Wooster, those are AP Computer Science Principles and our Art and Design classes).

- Remember, you can take the test in three ways:
 1. Use pen and paper to write your exam and then upload pictures
 2. Type your answers in a word document or similar software and upload the file
 3. Type your answers and "cut and paste" your answer into the test software
- If you have trouble logging into your My AP account, we are unable to help you unlock your account.
 4. You MUST call AP yourself as it is your account, not Wooster's account

Math Lessons for 5/15

Again, for phase 3 the district has created lessons for specific 4th year math classes online only (Pre-Calc, Prob/Stats/Discrete, Pre-College Math). Teachers if you have students who don't have online access to the assignments and they are in one of the 4th year math classes instruct them to do the Algebra 2 assignments or have them contact their math teacher via email.

Regardless of the subject all students are on lesson #17 (if students are utilizing the electronic forms only, they just need to click on the assignment listed under lesson #17 for their current class in the Mathematics Distance Learning file that everyone should have posted on Teams, but if they are working from the paper packet I have also included the page numbers that correspond with the daily assignment). The assignments are as follows:

Algebra 1 - Lesson 17 (paper packet page 22)

Geometry - Lesson 17 (paper packet page 33-34)

Algebra 2 - Lesson 17 (paper packet page 48-49)

Pre-Calc - Lesson 17 (online access only)

English Lesson

Daily Reading: 30 mins Book of Choice

Daily Writing: 1-2 Pages—either hard copy journal or submitted via Teams

Determination helps us work through challenges and set goals. Think about all the reading you have done this year. Describe a character who has exhibited determination even in difficult situations.

Teacher's Note: During the last month of school, students will be looking back on their school experience. Each daily writing task is designed to be a draft of a larger, final piece that may be submitted or kept for their future. The purpose of the writing is to reflect on the year (or on four years) and think about books, people, songs, friendship, etc. that have impacted them and have helped prepare them for the following year or their lives beyond high school. Students will write in different genres each day. During the last day, students can work on transitions and put together their "All About My High School Experience" writing.
